Paul likes sports of all kinds: basketball, football, swimming, skiing, but especially likes soccer.

All of the family has had major divine protection such as when Chrisy was saved from a head-on car crash when she was young with her mom; Paul Jr. fell in the murky waters of a pond but his dad saved him. Aubrey while climbing a hill on the property saw someone with a hatchet who threw it down and it hit her head causing a major bleed – Thankfully grandma and Yahaira to the rescue! Brooke has had her close calls too. Once down at the creek when mom was gone, the kids and dad went on a 4-wheeler and found themselves playing in the water. Returning, daddy ran over a bee's nest

Following is a letter I received from a dear friend who with her husband is a missionary to Thailand. I had a chance to help briefly several years ago when they were opening an English speaking school in Laos. It was a remarkable experience which remains in my memory in significant ways, not the least of which was the special couple mentioned below who left a lucrative position as Buddhists to become active and enthusiastic Christians in a Communist country, a difficult and dangerous decision. The supernatural aspects of their stories are remarkable in themselves.

Hi Auntie Pam!

I am sending hot and steamy hugs from Bangkok! We recently moved into a condo and we're LOVING the fact that we can air-condition the entire condo! It is a great break from the heat and humidity we get this time of year. Sadly, it means I can't have the windows and slider doors open to get fresh air. It's just not New England! But I guess the sacrifice is ok.

I am writing rather humbly to see if you could help us with something. You may remember that Somphavan and Edt have three children, Kuman (son), Bandan (daughter) and Tingkham (daughter, Tyler's age). Due to criticisms Somphavan has had of church leadership, he has been ostracized from the church for a couple of years now. When we were in Laos in April, we visited him and he told us that he hopes to go back to church in

the next year after they finish building the new church building. We are thrilled to hear that! In the meantime he is meeting with small groups that he has planted and is encouraging.

Sadly, Kuman and Bandan have left the church. Kuman recently married a Buddhist girl and plans to move to the south with her. Because of the spiritual condition of the home, we are concerned about Tingkham. She graduated from high school last year and would like to study to be a doctor. We have encouraged her to apply to Mountain View College in the Philippines. This school, an Adventist school, is known for engaging the students in outreach and evangelism. Those that we know who have studied there and have returned to Laos are on fire! They know who they believe, they know what they believe and they are motivated to share it with others!

Tingkham is excited with the idea of attending MVC. She is going through the application process and is registering to study nursing for the 2017-2018 school year beginning in mid-July. But now we are facing a dilemma - we don't have all the funds necessary to sponsor her. We are stepping out in faith that God will provide sponsors to help support her through school.

Please continue to pray for our work here in Laos. Also, keep Tingkham in your prayers. We are praying for God's leading in her life as she makes this next step in her life.



Missionaries to Turkey

The Browns are experiencing the Moslem holiday of Ramadan which is winding up at the end of June. Everywhere people are keeping this holiday of daily fasting and nightly feasting and the Brown's prayer is the people would genuinely seek a closer walk with God. They desire our prayers with theirs to this end. What a wonderful experience to be born again and have the assurance of salvation that comes through grace, not works. They look forward to the day others in their part of the vineyard will come to know that salvation.

They have a very special prayer request. It has become more difficult to obtain a resident permit within the city. The rules differ from city to city and are most difficult there. They can readily see the enemy's strategy: the city at one time stood alone with no Adventist presence among the three to four million people but that is changing. There are two families and a handful of Adventist youth who interact with the people every day. Surely the principalities and powers are angry. How comforting to realize God has a plan for the people in that place.

Trey and Vicky have just finished applying for their resident permits and

were granted a five month tourist permit. Their permits showed up a month late and their five months will expire in September. At that time, they cannot reapply unless they exit the country for six months. Then they could possibly be granted another five months. Other options have come to their attention through the immigration office. If they own a home or apartment and live in it, the government will give them a two-year Resident Permit. Every two years they can reapply and be granted two more years. The only problem with this option is funds. They have found that a home cost around 100,000-140,000 Turkish Lira which equates to \$30,000 - 40,000. This is extremely reasonable and seems like the right door and would make room for a few other ministry ideas God has given them. Currently, they rent for 1,400 lira a month and in eight more years that will equate to 134,400 lira. That being said, if they remain there, their investment in rent would be nearly the same as purchasing a house or apartment. Also their monthly need would drop due to not paying rent.

Thus, Trey and Vicky are asking us to join them in petitioning the throne of the Almighty for guidance and wisdom during this process. They appreciate our continual love and support so much!


Northern Bald Ibis



After hunting killed off the Northern Bald Ibis in Austria, the “Waldrapp” team first of all became foster-parents to a pair of these, then taught them their migration pattern by getting them to follow a microlight. This led to observations about the movement of air over the birds’ wings. Air passing over the upper side of the wing produces an “upwash”. A following bird can benefit from this by positioning itself to either side of the leader’s wash. Being directly behind would merely result in hitting the “downwash”. The extension of this when further birds join the flock leads to the V pattern adopted by skeins of birds in flight being the most efficient. So the project allowed these birds to find their way from Austria to Italy and gave evidence to validate the long-standing claim that the V shape was best.
