Although Bob was brought up in Raleigh NC, he was born in Indianapolis and moved to FL but from age 5, he lived in Raleigh. In 1991 he moved to Asheville for his job, opening an office for his HVAC equipment company. He lived in Asheville from 1991 – 1996 when he had a job offer in Greenville SC with a competitor HVAC equipment company. He worked there for ten years and one of his contractors, a family-owned business, tried to get him to come to work for them. They had his attention especially since they were very good Christian people. Unfortunately, in 1999 his wife left, leaving him a single parent so the offer to work with this family was appealing. Although the weather didn't look promising to see the Lights, the last night they were in Tromso the night sky cleared and it wound up being a highlight of their stay in Norway. They also went sailing in the fjords. They were gone ten days from March 7 through March 17 of this year. The trip was a combination of business and pleasure. Another trip they enjoyed was to Aruba going scuba diving and had a lot of fun! We asked Bob what a typical day for him was like. He is still working out of his home reviewing blueprints and looking at HVAC equipment. He interfaces with mechanical contractors and design engineers, prepares bids, and provides quotes and prepares documentation for the contractors, design engineers and the owners.

On the home front, Bob does the grocery shopping, cooks, and helps Karen wherever needed. They love their dog, Bella, who is a Labradoodle and three years old. They regularly take her to the dog park. Bob's favorite Bible verse is John 14:1-3 "Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also."



We learned that every child can only receive one shoebox in their lifetime. Children in many areas can attend a 12 week Bible school, similar to VBS to learn about Jesus.

Each of our students was so enthusiastic to pack their shoeboxes and they thought long and hard what to include. We prayed for the children who will receive our shoeboxes and we hope to one day meet them in the Heavenly Kingdom. Thank you for your prayers and support! The Myth of Spot Reducing Bev Cook

Many individuals believe that by exercising a specific area, the fat in the localized area will be utilized, thus reducing the locally stored fat. Although inches may be lost as the muscle tightens and strengthens, localized exercises do not require enough caloric expenditure to burn much fat. In addition, the body works as a unit, mobilizing fat from areas of highest concentration and not from specific localized areas. Exercise, even when localized and especially when done vigorously with the whole body, draws from all of the fat stores of the body, not just from the local deposits. All persons, however, have a genetic predisposition to deposit fat more readily in certain areas which are the last areas to slim down through a fat reduction program of exercise and fewer dietary calories.

A study utilized outstanding tennis players to investigate this phenomenon. They postulated that if spot reduction were a reality, the nondominant (inactive) arm should have substantially more fat than the dominant (active). They found absolutely no difference in the fat contents of the two arms despite greater arm girths (muscle hypertrophy) in the active arms. Both arms had the same amount of fat despite differences in activity. (Annals Int. Med. 74, 1971:408-11)


